Facts about the James Yates Scholarship

History

James L. Yates was a member of the Knights of Columbus Council and St. Martin of Tours parish. He was a man who knew God, loved Him and always served ‘with joy in his big heart’. Born in 1945, “Jim” Yates graduated from Bellarmine University in his hometown of Louisville, Kentucky. Following his time in the United States Air Force, James and his wife, Barbara, moved to Forney. Together they started Bow Wood Florist & Gift Shop and they served as volunteer accountants for St. Martin of Tours. Education was a passion of James Yates who was known to often encourage others to better themselves; even personally funding scholarships at St. Martin. His untimely death in 2004 deeply saddened our community. This scholarship program strives to honor his memory.

Process

The application for the scholarship and all supporting documents are considered **highly confidential**. Each application will be reviewed by a committee of several Knights of Columbus members who will only receive qualification data. *All identifying information* will be blocked out of all the committee documents. Each student is assigned a code so only the scholarship chairman will know the identity of each applicant.

The committee members rank each applicant on a weighted scale for **each of 5 areas** as outlined on the following Details sheet. The scholarship chairman *will facilitate the process*.

Each scholarship recipient is notified personally and arrangements made for a community presentation of the scholarship. *Participation in the community presentation is required to receive the scholarship*. We’ll help with that.

James Yates Scholarship Details

Deadline

- July 3, 2025 hand delivered; postmarked by July 1, 2025.

Eligibility

- Any graduating senior who is active at St. Martin or member of an active St. Martin family.
- Any senior whose father is a Knight of Columbus member in good standing in Council 13133.
- Any graduating senior meeting one of the above criteria **and** who has been accepted at a college, university, or technical school.
- Late or incomplete applications will be automatically disqualified.

Forms

- Applicants may receive an application via email by requesting one from the Scholarship Chairman, or from the Knights of Columbus website at: ***kofc13133.com***
- *All 7 sections* of application **must be completed in the student's handwriting.**
- Completed applications may be scanned and submitted to the chairman via email.

Documentation

- School transcripts are ideally sealed from the school.
- When you list **any event or activity** on the James Yates Scholarship application form, scholastic or civil, it is important that you **attach supporting documentation.**
 - For example, if you state that you were an altar server, a letter or note from Father Patrick would greatly enhance your qualifications
 - Likewise, if you are a member of the National Honor Society or other school activity, a letter from a counselor, teacher, or principal would improve your chances as well.

Evaluation Weights (sections 1-5)

- Academic Achievement (30%)
 - SAT **or** ACT scores
 - GPA (grade point average) – class ranking
 - Academic achievements (eg. Math competitions, etc.)
- Extra-Curricular School and Community Involvement (35%)
- Church Activities and Involvement (35%)
